WHAT MADE ME STOP



Twelve years wasn’t just physical suffering. It carried isolation, shame, and exhaustion.



Jesus stopped for one person in a crowd.

He already knew who touched Him, and He still asked, “Who touched Me?”



The greatest miracle may have been her restoration.

Jesus didn’t just heal her body—He restored her dignity and her place.



One word changed everything...

Daughter.

That word spoke identity, acceptance, and belonging.

TRUTH TO CARRY

Jesus sees individual faith even in the middle of a crowd.



Faith reaches toward Christ—not merely toward religious symbols.



Jesus restores more than physical wounds; He restores dignity, identity, and peace.



The miracle is not only what Jesus heals, but how He restores us.



GRIT PRACTICE

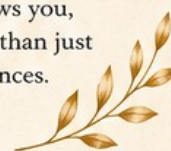
This Week
